## **END OF FEDERAL BENEFITS**FACT SHEET



On September 4, 2021, in accordance with federal law, several federal unemployment benefits offered through the American Rescue Plan Act will end.

If you are currently receiving one of the following benefits, this notice is important for you. The following benefits will expire:

- Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)
- Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)
- Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)
- Mixed Earners Unemployment Compensation (MEUC)

Under federal law, no PUA, PEUC, FPUC, or MEUC payments may be made after the week ending September 4 regardless of your balance at the time of program termination. The amount you will receive as part of your weekly unemployment benefits after September 4 will be impacted by these changes from the federal government. The benefit amount in D.C., based on eligibility and wage information submitted to DOES, can range from \$50 to \$444 per week. You can estimate your weekly benefit amount by visiting DCNetworks.org and clicking Estimate Your Benefits.

Eligible claimants receiving traditional unemployment insurance benefits in the District will continue to be paid. If a claimant's traditional unemployment benefits have been exhausted or a traditional claim has expired, individuals must file a new claim or reopen an existing claim to be determined for eligibility or to continue receiving benefits to which they may be entitled.
